### Summer Precollege Enrichment Program (PREP) July 10-22, 2011

The Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine (MSUCOM) OsteoCHAMPS Precollege Enrichment Program is designed to give selected underrepresented and disadvantaged high school students an opportunity to explore prerequisites for advanced training with particular emphasis on Osteopathic Medicine. This program uses the modalities of instruction, hands-on practical sessions, site visits, socialization, guidance, and mentorship to accomplish this aim. The ultimate goal of this program is to develop and maintain a viable application pool for MSUCOM, other colleges of Osteopathic Medicine, and other health career training institutions from the OsteoCHAMPS PREP participants.

## OsteoCHAMPS Program Eligibility

- 1) Be entering the 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade in the fall of 2011 at a West Michigan area school (within the counties of Muskegon, Ottawa, or Oceana).
- 2) Pledge to abide by all rules and regulations of Michigan State University, The Housing Facility, and the OsteoCHAMPS Program.
- 3) Meet the federal guidelines for *Educationally Disadvantaged* and/or *Economically Disadvantaged* in order to be considered for financial sponsorship.
- 4) Submit application and all documents to the Osteopathic Foundation of West Michigan on or before the April 15 application deadline.
- 5) Be approved by the Osteopathic Foundation of West Michigan for sponsorship.

### Federal Guidelines – Definitions

#### *Educationally Disadvantaged*

An individual who comes from an environment that has inhibited the individual from obtaining the knowledge, skills, and abilities required to enroll in and graduate from a health profession school or allied health program.

#### *Economically Disadvantaged*

An individual who comes from a family with an annual income at or below low-income thresholds according to family size, published by the U.S. Bureau of the Census, adjusted annually for changes in the Consumer Price Index, and adjusted by the Secretary for use in all health and allied health profession programs.

#### Eligibility Exception

OsteoCHAMPS under the auspices of MSUCOM, may open a few positions to students who do not meet the Educationally and/or Economically Disadvantaged qualifications and who are willing to pay their own tuition of \$2,000.
